Commander Ryan Bernacchi is a native of Los Altos, California and graduated from Mountain View High School in 1992, where he lettered in water polo and swimming. He attended the University of California, San Diego, and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology through the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps in 1996, and was commissioned an Ensign in the U.S. Navy.

Commander Bernacchi joined the Blue Angels in September 2015. He has accumulated more than 3,500 flight hours and 600 carrier-arrested landings. His decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal, one Individual Air Medal with Combat "V" (three Strike Flight), four Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medals, one with Combat "V," and numerous unit, campaign, and service awards.

Captain Doster Retires from Naval Service, Captain Alfonzo Assumes Command

In a ceremony at Naval Air Facility on January 20th, Captain Doster became a civilian after 25 years of Naval service. In that same ceremony, Captain Brent "Fever" Alfonzo assumed command, as the "Navy Mayor" of NAF El Centro.

A native of Poway, California, CAPT Brent Alfonzo joined the Navy in August 1988, reporting to the Naval Academy Preparatory School. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the United States Naval Academy, and was commissioned as an ensign upon his graduation with the class of 1993. He reported to NAS Pensacola, Fla. for primary and helicopter flight training, and was winged as a naval aviator in November 1995. He earned a Master's Degree in Global Leadership from the University of San Diego in April 2001.

Alfonzo's numerous operational assignments include Helicopter Antisubmarine Squadron (HS) 4 "Black Knights" with an embark aboard USS Abraham Lincoln (CVN 72); Carrier Air Wing (CVW) 14 as Helicopter Operations Officer and Seahawk Weapons and Tactics Instructor; a return to HS-4 as operations department head, and HS-6 "Indians" as executive officer with follow on assignment as commanding officer. During this tour, the Indians completed a successful deployment in support of Operation

Enduring Freedom, and transitioned from HS-6 to Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 6, upgrading the squadron to the highly capable MH-60S Seahawk helicopter. He has accumulated 4,400 flight hours in his flying career.

Alfonzo's shore and staff assignments include HS-10 "Warhawks" as fleet replacement squadron instructor, and with the Joint Chiefs of Staff Operations Directorate in the National Military Command Center. In addition, he served as Rotary Wing Weapons School Department Head at Naval Strike and Air Warfare Center, NAS Fallon, Nevada, and as WTI Program Director at Naval Mine and Anti-Submarine Warfare Command and Naval Surface and Mine Warfighting Development Center.

His personal awards include the Legion of Merit, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (second award), Air Medal (three Strike/Flight awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (fourth award), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (fourth award), and various individual, unit and campaign awards.

has hired Naval Science Instructor, Command Master Chief Ted Gallinat, USN (Retired), to formulate the Cadet program under the Navy National Defense Cadet Corps (NNDCC) program until it is certified by the U.S. Navy as an NJROTC program.

The NNDCC program provides schools that do not qualify for a NJROTC unit an opportunity to provide a similar program designed to expand students' opportunities to gain the values of citizenship, service to the United States, personal responsibility and a sense of accomplishment.

The NNDCC program is modeled on the NJROTC program except it is primarily funded by host schools. The NNDCC units use the NJROTC curriculum.



Some of the benefits of an NJROTC program are a substantial percentage of the NJROTC cadets who are graduating seniors continue to higher education; it is motivational in encouraging cadets to graduate from high school and continue to higher education offering free ACT/SAT preparation; cadets have higher attendance, are role models for the avoidance of substance abuse, have higher self-esteem, develop positive life skills, on average have higher grade point averages and graduate at a higher rate. Cadets learn the value of teamwork and individual accomplishments from belonging to NJROTC. The program enhances the image of the military in the eyes of the community by providing a chance for success to the nation's youth.

While the training is along military lines, it is conducted so as to encourage initiative and individuality to develop natural gifts, to teach self-control, develop personal character, responsibility and qualities of integrity, loyalty, and dedication.

It is an honor for the Imperial Valley Council to take this important step to continue to fulfill its core mission to expose young people to the values of our sea services.

New Signs and Security Requirements Required for Guests


We've all been there—it's that moment, the moment that many will face as you drive up to the main gate at the Base: You think to yourself, "Will I be allowed on base?" To ensure that you are not turned away by the gate guard, let us help you eliminate the fear of rejection by being aware of our local installation's policies.

I.D. requirements can be frustrating at times, especially if you are unaware of the policies. We must all remember that the rules are there to ensure safety and accountability for everyone associated with the military.

As you approach NAF El Centro, please be mindful of new signage posted outside the outermost gate. The sign signals you to stop outside the gate, and wait for the sentry to motion you to approach the gate house. You are also directed to dim your headlights before approaching the gate. This ensures the sentry is able to get a good visual on your vehicle and occupants. It is important not to obstruct their vision by bright vehicle headlights.
